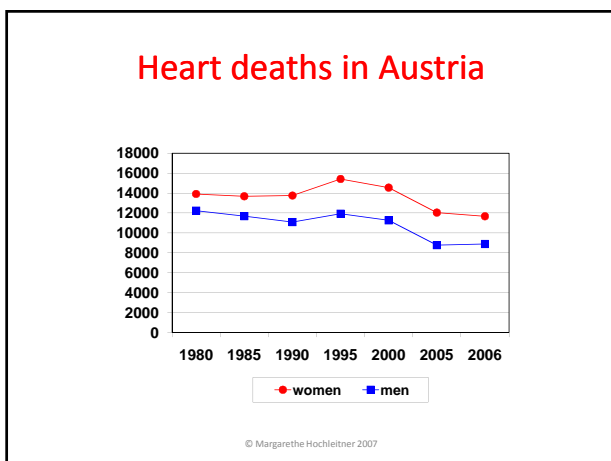




Gender Bias?

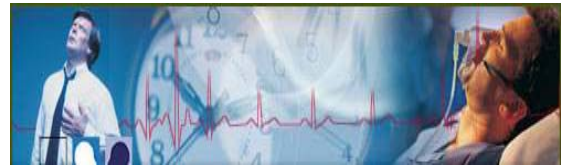

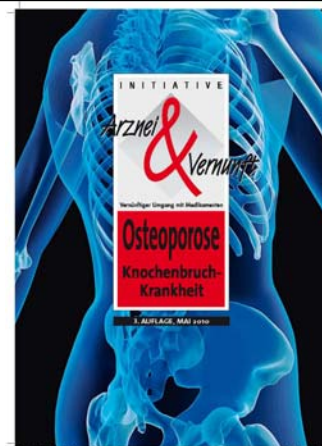
